Beginning with age three and working up, Steve shares specific ways a parent can start equipping a son with the character and skills needed to eventually be a successful single-income wage earner. Learn these principles from a dad whose twenty-four-year-old homeschooled son purchased a home debt free a year before his marriage, and whose second son is doing the same. The session has been very helpful for parents of daughters as well.

Charles Spurgeon once said, "Have you no wish for others to be saved? Then you are not saved yourself. Be sure of that." While many believers might have a deep desire to see others saved, they aren't actively sharing their faith.
